- 4. What may be Right, Real, or True to you may not be the same for someone else. Everyone is entitled to their feelings and opinions, please respect that right.
- 5. This is a forum for positive engagement and cooperation. Provide constructive feedback and ask clarifying questions rather than providing negative commentary.

Questions to Consider

These questions are here to get the conversation started – everyone who attended chose to come for a reason, what was it?

What type of relationship are you in now? How has it evolved over time?

Have you identified yourself or your relationship differently in the past?

What are some feelings you associate with the various relationship types? Are some feelings more appropriate for certain relationships than others?

Most relationships require at least some amount of work, what are some of the harder ones to maintain?

Have you ever started one style of relationship and then settled into another? How did you handle the transition?

How do you integrate your various identities/relationships into your daily life? What are some of the little things that help you maintain your sanity/enjoyment/excitement/happiness?
